

Fabric Care Instructions



CARE AND CLEANING OVERVIEW

Outdura® fabric should be cleaned regularly to prevent excessive dirt from accumulating. Simply brush off any loose dirt and rinse with lukewarm water. To clean, use a solution of lukewarm water (not exceed ing 100° F) and a mild natural soap such as LuxTM or IvoryTM. Rinse thoroughly to remove excess soap. F or light cleaning, avoid the use of detergents. Normal wear, usage and cleaning will reduce the effectiven ess of Outdura's water-resistant finish. If water resistancy is important, a water-resistancy treatmentshoul d be used if the fabric has been cleaned or if the fabric is constantly exposed to atmospheric elements. If y ou have a difficult stain, from paint to lipstick, please refer to the Stain Removal Chart below to treat it.

OUTDOOR FURNITURE - CARE AND CLEANING

NEVER DRY CLEAN OUTDURA. IF NECESSARY, CAREFULLY IRON ON SYNTHETIC SETTING; DO NOT USE STEAM. DO NOT MACHINE DRY OUTDURA. AIR DRY ONLY.

For maintenance, brush off dirt. Add ¼ cup of mild soap to a gallon of lukewarm water. Use a sponge or soft brush to apply the solution, allowing it to soak into fabric. Rinse thoroughly with clean water, then air dry. Removable umbrella and cushion covers may be machine washed in cold water using normal amounts of mild soap. Air dry. To spot-clean, spray with a mist of water and mild soap, then clean vigorously with a sponge, brush or clean towel. Rinse thoroughly in clean water, then air dry, blot or use a wet-vacuum. Repeat final steps until all soap residue is gone. To clean stubborn stains and/or mildew, use 1 cup bleach and 1/4 cup of mild soap per gallon of clean water \(\) (increase for severe stans). Soak affected area for 20 minutes before using sponge or clean towel to remove stain. Rinse well and air dry.

INDOOR FURNITURE - CARE AND CLEANING

Never dry clean Outdura. If necessary, carefully iron on synthetic setting; do not use steam. Do not machine dry Outdura. Air dry only.

To maintain, brush regularly, wipe spills as they occur and spot-clean stains. Hand-wash removable covers by soaking in gallon of lukewarm water to which a quarter-cup of mild soap has been added. Sponge or brush as necessary. Rinse thoroughly in clean water. Air dry. Machine-wash removable covers in cold water and mild soap. Air dry. To spot-clean upholstered pieces, spray with a mist of water and mild soap, then sponge or brush lightly. Rinse thoroughly in clean water, then air dry, blot or use a wet-vacuum. Repeat final steps until all soap residue is gone. To clean stubborn stains and/or mildew, use 1 cup bleach and 1/4 cup of mild soap per gallon of clean water (increase for severe stains). Soak affected area for 20 minutes before using sponge or clean towel to remove stain. Rinse well and air dry.
